Ring Sizing Guide

Ring sizing can be challenging, so we have developed a guide to assist you. While a majority of our rings can be resized easily, there are certain types that are not resizable, such as those with stones or patterns all around. HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

Before proceeding, use a ruler to confirm the printed paper size in the box below

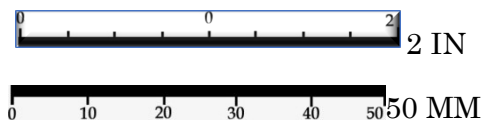
Pull tightly. The sizer must fit snugly to produce an accurate size.

Measure your finger at the time of the day when it will be at its largest, this is usually at the end of the day.

Avoid measuring your fingers when they are cold or damp.

Bands and rings over 5mm in width may fit your finger more tightly than rings of the same size in narrower widths.

CONFIRM PRINTED PAPER SIZE



PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

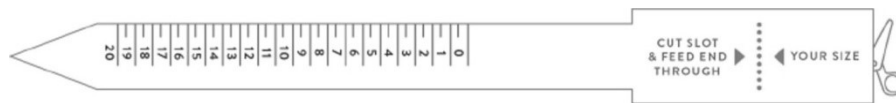
Please carefully check the length of the bar above to ensure that it has been printed precisely as 2 inches or 50 millimeters. If the measurement is not accurate, the ring size measurement will not be performed correctly.

METHOD 2: PRINT YOUR SIZER

Please remove the ring sizer provided below by cutting it out.

Gently wrap the ring sizer around the widest part of the desired finger, ensuring that the numbers are visible to you. Insert the pointed end through the previously made slit in the sizer, securing it snugly.

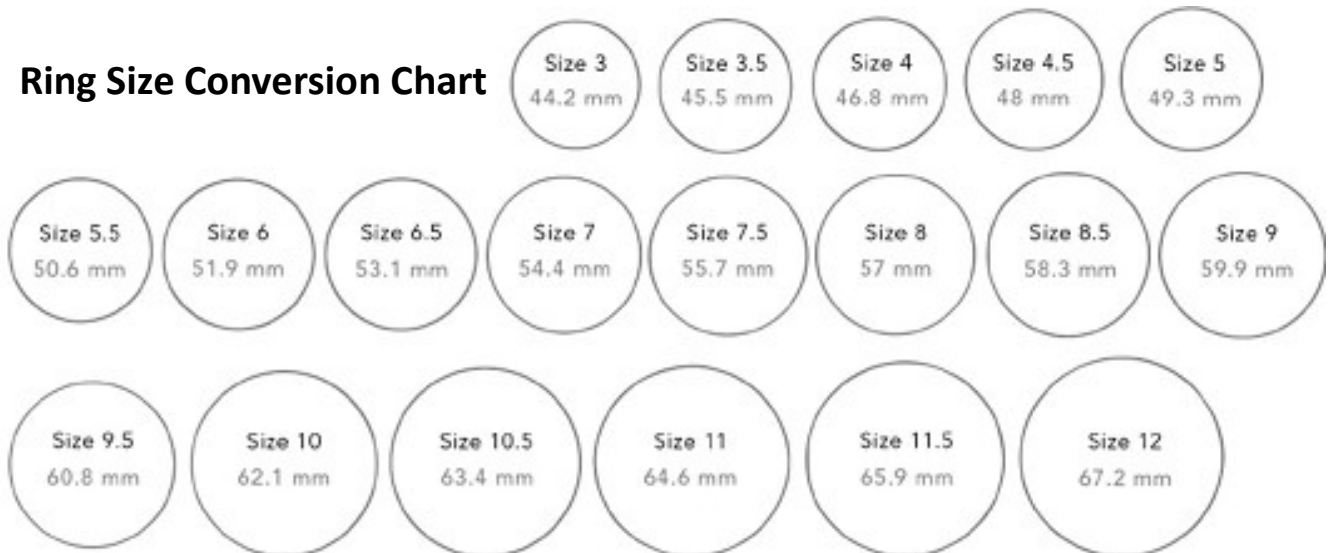
Take note of the number that aligns with the slit; this indicates your ring size. Remember that quarter sizes are also an option if the sizer indicates that you fall between whole and half sizes.



METHOD 3: MEASURE A CURRENT RING

- Select a ring that accurately corresponds to the size of the finger for which you intend to purchase the ring. In the United States, it is customary to wear engagement rings and wedding bands on the ring finger of the left hand.
- Place the ring on top of the size circles provided below and compare the inside edge of the ring to the circles on the guide until you find the closest match.
- If the ring's size falls between two options, it is recommended to choose the quarter size that falls in the middle.
